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| 1 | <p>Meeting began with <i>Sai Gayatri</i> prayer.</p> <p>IQAC Chairperson welcomed the members to the meeting by emphasizing the importance of looking beyond NAAC parameters in matters of institutional quality. He called for a united and selfless commitment to the continuous enhancement of quality at SSSIHL, emphasizing the need to nurture the core foundational principles of the system through sustainable educational development, reminding the faculty members that they are the foot soldiers and the onus to take it forward rests on them. Additionally, he underscored the need for active community outreach, highlighting it as a golden opportunity for students to understand societal needs and translate their learning into meaningful action to address real-world challenges.</p> | NA |

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| | <p>Goals (SDGs) and should be reported accordingly to gain better visibility.</p> <p>Dr. Rama then enquired about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The status of SSSIHL's association with the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA)• It was replied that while SSSIHL has registered under the scheme, it has to appoint a UBA coordinator and adopt minimum 5 villages as required. <p>An internal IQAC member raised a question regarding:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lack of student participation from SSSIHL in these camps. <p>IQAC Chairperson who was previously an active participant in organizing the camps responded:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Several efforts had been made to involve students. However, due to their demanding academic schedules, student engagement had been limited. Going forward, it was agreed that more active steps would be taken to ensure student involvement. <p>Sri Niranjan proposed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Students be engaged from the initial stages, including preparatory work such as obtaining government permissions, to the final execution and management of the camps. This hands-on involvement would help students gain a comprehensive understanding of the complexities involved in organizing such initiatives. <p>Dr. Rama suggested:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Expand the scope of participation from national to international levels. | |
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| | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Instead of merely reporting activities, develop detailed case studies based on the success stories. These case studies should be publicly accessible through the institution's website and can be studied and analyzed by the students. | |
| 4 | <p>The presentation (attached in email) was well-received. Observations and suggestions based on the discussion:</p> <p>Dr. Rama suggested:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Institute can bear the fees for the SWAYAM courses for which the students enroll. | <p>To submit a proposal to admin to implement the peer mentoring model across departments</p> |



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| 5 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All departments demonstrated strong performance in curricular activities, teaching-learning processes, and student satisfaction, as reflected in the recent review. However, notable gaps were observed in the areas of research, student progression, and faculty development. • The underperformance in the research dimension was attributed to a low number of quality publications, limited funded and consultancy projects, and a small number of students with research fellowships such as JRF/SRF. • Departments acknowledged poor performance in student support and progression, attributing it largely to inadequate seriousness in data submission. They assured that this issue would be promptly addressed. In the area of faculty development, the subpar performance was due to partial and underutilized engagement with the support systems provided by the administration. • Departments collectively expressed confidence that performance across these dimensions would improve significantly with the inclusion of data from the academic year 2024–25. • Dr. Rama suggested: • The Institute should not restrict themselves only to NAAC guidelines as NAAC is an accreditation agency and not a statutory body which requires compliance to its regulations/standards. • The inclusion of apprenticeship programs as a means to enhance student progression metrics. • SSSIHL must register as a SWAYAM Local Chapter to further support faculty and student development. • The Department of Education should initiate | <p>To start 2024-25 data collection</p> <p>To disseminate IDP to all stakeholders</p> |
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research projects in areas such as Early Childhood Care (ECE), Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) and learning material development, with potential funding support from Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR). Such projects should focus on the Anganwaadis.

- As part of internship, students from department of education should be exposed to all types of schools namely, Government, Private and Aided.
- Along with Student Satisfaction Survey, alumni satisfaction survey should also be taken up.
- Websites of Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF), ICSSR, Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) should be constantly monitored to identify different research grants schemes which are released by the Govt. from time to time.

IQAC chairperson noted:

- Presentations on departmental performance should include quantifiable data and metrics for greater clarity and accountability, rather than relying on general qualitative descriptors.

Dr. Rama inquired about:

- The status of Institute Development Plan (IDP).

IQAC Chairperson responded:

- IDP has been drafted and submitted to the the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust. After their approval, it will be submitted to the UGC.

Dr. Rama recommended:

- IDP be made publicly accessible by uploading it to the institution's official website.
